1938 LaSalle 5011 Touring Sedan By Richard Nalavany



My first impression when I saw the vehicle was of a tired old boxer; the scars were evident. It had a presence that emitted a forlorn cause and hopelessness. I couldn't walk away from this object without feeling guilty of something. I felt obligated to rescue it. The provenance of the car was mostly a mystery. I was told it may have been a stock car racer during the 1950s.

I had the chassis delivered to my home while I followed with a truck full of parts. The engine was not original to the car but a military type most likely used during WWII. The engine didn't last long. The block cracked from lack of anti-freeze during a very cold winter. Someone had made a feeble attempt on a restoration, sandblasting the body including the windows! As in most cases similar to this I didn't know what I was getting into. However, things turned out well. I met a guy with a 1938 LaSalle who had just converted his car into a street rod. I purchased his engine, transmission, steering wheel and column, radiator, generator and starter for a great price.








I had the car painted and engine rebuilt. The interior was done by a friend of mine Charlie; an excellent interior craftsman. It took me eighteen years to get the car all together and finally finish the restoration, a tremendous accomplishment.

A recession with a depression didn't help Cadillac's bottom line at all, production numbers were half the amount from the previous year. In 1938 LaSalle sold 14,635 vehicles while Cadillac only sold 9,268 vehicles for the model year. The 1938 LaSalle 5011 Two Door Touring Sedan sold for \$1345, the second least expensive model available only


Selling Cadillacs During the Age of Eisenhower, Part Two – The Ad Men By Edwin Benson

When is an ad successful?

Ultimately, there is no objective standard. If the product sells well, we can argue that the product would have sold well anyway. On the other hand, low sales can be explained by an inferior product or economic hard times.

To intelligently discuss Cadillac advertising, it is necessary to start with a brief look at Theodore MacManus. MacManus is one of advertising's pioneers. In his book, *The Mirror Makers*, Stephen Fox credits him with being the primary founder of the school of advertising that builds a relationship with the customer. As Fox puts it,


"Cars like Buick and Cadillac were expensive items that customers bought infrequently, usually after careful planning and scrimping. So, MacManus did not try to persuade his readers to go right out and buy the product. Instead, he aimed to build a durable image of reliable quality, year after year, that would send the consumer to General Motors whenever the big decision to buy was made."



MacManus's ads varied widely. In one case in 1912, he only uses six words to announce the coming of the self-starter.



On the other hand, his The Penalty of Leadership is positively verbose from 1915.



If one had to sort out the work of MacManus and that of his younger partner, James R. Adams, you could say that MacManus contributed the tone and that Adams constructed the template. That template that would continue throughout Adams's two decades with Cadillac, and for thirty years after his death. It made Cadillac an icon.

The most obvious message –style and wealth – was handled by single large illustration. That image was consistent over hundreds of pieces of advertising and many years. It laid the foundation for the future – creating fantasies of wealth.

The second piece was usually a tag line to emphasize the desired message of the illustration.

The third element usually carried a theme of value for money. Adams showed that Cadillac style was surprisingly accessible. Adams's accomplished this task by pointing out that looking at all of the costs, rather than simply focusing on the purchase price, showed that the Cadillac was less expensive than it appeared.

Perhaps Cadillac stuck with a winning formula too long. The world of the 1980s was very different than that of the 1950s. On the other hand, it sure sold a lot of cars.

The 1979 Eldorado - The (Mostly) Shrinking Cadillac

Cadillac announces a magnificent new



1978 would be the last year of the seventh generation Eldorado with GM producing 46,816 vehicles that year. The 1978 Eldorado would also be longest wheel base of any front wheel drive ever made at 126.3 inches.

Then in 1979 something happened with the eighth generation of Eldorados. GM shrunk the car by nearly two feet and made it 1,100 pounds lighter! The buying public must have liked what they saw. A total of 67,436 Eldoarados were made in 1979; about 50% more than the previous year. Although the 1979 model only seats 4, the usable truck space was improved as was the leg room. Plus new four-wheel independent suspension, electronic fuel injection, side window defoggers, wire wheel discs and other new features. Also available was the latest entertainment system; AM/FM Stereo Radio with a Cassette Player, 8 Track Player or 40 Channel CB Radio.

As you can see Cadillac managed to make the overall car smaller, as was the trend in the 1970s, yet still made the car feel big. There was slightly more front and rear head room, eight tenths of an inch of front leg room more with almost four inches of additional rear leg room than the 1978 model.

Or in Light Blue Dante cloth. There's also the elegance of one-piece plush Tangier carpeting which simulates fine fur. Individual rear seat reading lamps. And leather-trimmed steering wheel. 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The Biarritz models automatically came with tufted pillow-style leather in two shades, or in light blue Dante cloth, along with "one-piece plush Tangier carpeting." A leather-wrapped steering wheel was also standard, as well as an instrument panel finished in simulated burled walnut.



For those who wanted a truly unique vehicle, there was the very limited production San Remo Dorado custom made by Coach Design Group in Westlake Village, California listing for a whopping \$42,500 (\$178,000 in today's dollars). Overall the 1979 Eldorado was a smaller Cadillac tastefully done.

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
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
