Important Board Announcements

Results from CLC winter BOD meeting, January 28, 2023 Please take time to read all changes.

- 1. With the approaching retirement of Mike and Nancy Book (April 15), the BOD approved hiring Cornerstone Registration, Maple Grove, MN, as our office and membership management company. They will assume official duties April 1, with a NEW mailing address, a NEW email address, and a NEW office phone number. More details and information in the upcoming days and weeks.
- 2. Due to the transition of membership data and other pertinent information to a new website, it was decided and approved that there will be no attempt to produce a 2024 Membership Directory either electronically or printed. However, every effort will be made to offer for purchase a printed Membership Directory for 2025.
- 3. All membership dues were approved for a modest increase. All existing dues (excluding E-membership) will increase \$10.00 annually effective April 1. Lifetime membership, available to an existing member of 10 years, will increase to \$1,250 domestically and \$1,500 other countries effective April 1. All dues categories DO NOT include a published Membership Directory. Any surviving spouse of a lifetime member will no longer benefit from membership effective December 31. We will be glad to accept survivor spouse membership applications.
- 4. Effective with Gettysburg 2024 GN, all car judging will be on Friday. CLC and MRC board meetings will be scheduled on Saturday; all cars registered will be required to remain on display through Saturday at 4:00 pm unless removal is approved by National Chief Judge. These enhancements will allow tabulators sufficient time to accurately complete judging results and the awards committee time to assemble appropriate awards.
- 5. A "rain policy" was approved by the BOD to be enacted at the Albuquerque GN. In the event that rain or inclement weather exists, and judging is halted or canceled, there will be no further judging and NO awards issued for any cars previously judged. More details to follow.
- 6. Our webmaster, Stefan, asks everyone to access their member profile ASAP and edit all information to facilitate accurate personal/vehicle information for transfer into the new system.

Hank Hallowell's 1962 & 1973 Eldorados

I grew up in a typical Eisenhower era family: success in our neighborhood was measured by how

many speeds your Schwinn bicycle had, what your baseball card collection consisted of, and whether or not you were an early pick for the neighborhood baseball game.

It was also of passing interest where you vacationed and how old your parents and grandparents cars were. It's hard to imagine now, but, when I was a kid a 10 year old car was pretty much unheard of. Many people bought a new car every other year, or every year. That was the case with my grandparents.

Every year "or so" they would get a new Cadillac. My grandmother would have a 56 that was replaced with a new 59. My grandfather



had 54, replaced with a gray 58 and so on. There were a parade of Cadillac sedans thru the 60's thru 1973 when she acquired her last one: a powder blue sedan DeVille with a navy leather interior and white top.

In those days - for many people a Cadillac was "the purchase of a lifetime" and it represented to those who cared that you were a success in life. For some it was a purchase carefully thought out and not squandered....meaning you bought it, used it only on "special occasions" and kept garaged and possibly covered and out of sight.

I've always had my favorites and when the opportunity to buy a single family owned 61 6 window in



black with a signature black and white interior came up - I grabbed it. It had a perfect interior, beautiful chrome. Sadly it had something spill on it leaving a series of spots on all of the flat surfaces. After carefully acquiring some black magic mirror lacquer and painting the flat surfaces and a set of correct tires, the car looked just perfect.

I never thought of getting rid of that car until I saw an equally spectacular 62 Eldorado Biarritz in a stunning shade of lavender called "heather" by Cadillac...with matching plum full leather interior. In those days full

leather at Fleetwood meant just what it said, not leather seating surfaces that we have today.



I've always liked knowing the cars history and (maybe wrongly) felt that it adds to the value of the

car. In this case, my 62 spent the part of its life providing stylish transport in somewhat small town of Longview Washington (state) located just on the Oregon border. Purchased by Dr. W.L. Ray at the local Cadillac/Oldsmobile/GMC/Jeep/Studebaker dealer.

Dr. Ray didn't use the car much - perhaps his wife - and kept the car nearly two decades eventually selling it to a friend. This brings us into the 80's at which time it went into a series of private collections until reaching me, in exchange partly, for my 61.

I've always been drawn to the 61/62 Cadillacs (we all have our favorites) because of their "skeg" styling, restrained fins and beautiful

The car has most of the luxurious Cadillac equipment including 6 way power seat, power vents and windows, power door locks, autronic eye, wonder bar radio, automatic trunk lock and release. Everyring works perfectly including the clock.

details. I try to be careful when I use my 62 and avoid foul weather (Radnor Hunt Concours excluded). Today my 62 slumbers in a temperature controlled environment showing just 31,000 miles on the odometer.













I've always appreciated the styling of the 71-76 Eldorado convertibles. For me they are the apex of General Motors styling. The end of the line for styling for prestige sake, not handicapped by external pressures either OPEC, the government, the EPA etc..

For me it is everything Cadillac at it's flamboyant peak: four fender styling, long hood/short deck, 500 V8, front drive.....at that

time you knew a mile away what was coming at you....an Eldorado convertible.

Everyone has their personal tastes. I'm a fender skirt guy. I've always preferred certain cars with skirts. To be clear: factory skirts. Not the after market grafted on variety...thank you very much.

Accordingly the 71-74's are my favorites, especially the 73 with wreath rear side marker lamps, clean

side elevation and egg crate grill. So when I saw an add in the Self Starter for an original white 73 with a red leather interior (one of my favorite combos)....I called. After a conversation or two I bought the car.

The car was largely a one owner car, with two follow up CLC owners.

Originally Purchased by a lady dealer-bookkeeper as retirement gift to herself (what a way to retire). She had taken her car and left her native Mt.






Clemens, Michigan for a happy retired life in sunny Osprey, Florida.

Aside from typical 73 Eldorado maladies (rusted away manifold studs, a torn drive boot, and head gaskets needing attention) it was a straightforward car: very nice original paint, top, and leather interior. A little TLC, elbow grease, and attention to details, like dying faded red areas, steering wheel restoration and leather upholstery cleaning and judiciously applied touch-up the Eldorado looked like a new car (or at least a preserved one.



Interestingly, with help of Brian Rachlin and the Clubs VIN decoding, it was quickly discovered that this car is one of approximately 500 pace car editions produced for 1973. I wondered why it seemed to have extra stripes which I was foolishly thinking about removing (yikes)!

After a quick 180 degree change in direction, the car has been carefully preserved - including the stripes - and a set of correctly lettered pace car decals acquired and preserved as well. All thanks to VFR/CLC member and friend Brian Rachlin. Joining the CLC and the region really helped me realize my dream of owning one of this generation Eldorados.






NBC's 1952 Cadillac TV Studio Limousine By Robert Schles

You may have read in the January 2023 issue of *The Self-Starter* about 1953 Eldorado #2 which was used for President Dwight Eisenhower's Inauguration on January 20th 1953. What you might not know, that was not the only Cadillac in the Inaugural Parade that day. Making its "inaugural" debut was NBC's 1952 Series 75 self-contained TV mobile studio. The World's first and only "Traveling Eye" Cadillac mobile unit. In the early 1950s, most TV networks and stations used large trucks or buses for their Television mobile remote units, as TV



cameras and electrical equipment were extremely large and bulky during this time (the camera





C. H. Colledge, NBC's Director of Engineering Operations who thought up the idea for the limousine studio, believed a TV mobile vehicle "should be as mobile as newsreels". He got together his engineers, sketched out a proposal, then NBC commissioned GM to build the TV vehicle from a 1952 Cadillac Series 75 in

the Fall of 1952. GM took a standard Series 75 vehicle off the assembly line then gutted the interior. It took two months to modify the vehicle with necessary one ton of broadcast equipment. The Cadillac Mobile TV Studio typically carried a driver who was also a back-up camera-man, the main camera operator, an antenna operator, an



audio-visual technician, and the reporter. The Cadillac limousine was equipped with blacked-out

rear windows to prevent spurious light reflections on the TV monitors. The quarters were tight inside; they only had bicycle-type seats to sit on. With the added one ton of equipment the vehicle rides a little lower than usual as can be seen in some of the photos. The modified vehicle features two roof-mounted tank machine-gun turrets over two sliding roof panels. Mounted on roller bearings on each of these turrets (giving 360 degree



rotation) are the TV camera and the a microwave transmission antenna; each has its own operator who can stick his whole upper body thru the open roof panels. In the trunk was a gasoline powered three kilowatt generator to power all the technical equipment. The whole thing was a sophisticated rolling TV studio. The stock 331 cubic inch V8 was unmodified and powerful enough to allow the Cadillac to "weave through traffic with the supple ease of a frighten deer". Total cost then was \$62,00 – about \$650,000 today.




NBC used "Traveling Eye" Cadillac mobile unit into the 1960s. Although President Kennedy rode in a Lincoln for his inauguration, several Cadillacs were used along the parade route that day. 












NBC's \$62,000

BOOOOOM! An ugly rumble thunders through the canyons of New York City. Fifteen miles away, across the Hudson River, a huge ball of dirty black smoke billows upward over New Jersey's industrial valley. Something big has exploded! Within minutes, sirens wail as fire and rescue apparatus, along with speeding press and radio cars, head for the river tunnels to converge on the disaster area. Most of this rocketing horde is familiar. But, within the past few weeks, a brandnew mystery car has joined the pack. It's a sleek, black Cadillae limousine with blacked-out rear windows. It weaves through traffic with the supple ease of a frightened deer. From a pair of low hatches in its roof, the heads and torsos of two men jut through steel rings of standard Army tank machine-gun turrets. But they handle no guns. One circular track supports a television camera mounted on rollers that permit it to sweep in a full 360°. On the

other sits a big, barrel-shaped antenna whose "question mark" can be aimed in any direction to maintain continuous lineof-sight contact with a studio antenna atop a skyscraper. Packed in the limousine's trunk, a generator whirs up the electric power to run its ton of special electronic equipment. Behind blacked-out windows, video and audio engineers control what its designers claim as the most compact monitoring studio ever devised. A sardine couldn't gain space in this gleaming vehicle. The mystery car is NBC's self-contained mobile studio, packed in the narrow confines of a standard production-line automobile. On the way to a disaster like that hypothetical explosion, it may telecast on the run. Once there, it can be set up in stationary position and bounce a signal for 20 miles to the home station for relay.

Along with other new developments—

Along with other new developments—including a midget eight-pound TV camera a little larger than a box-type Brownie, and

conceived the idea for the limousine studio, "should be as mobile as newsreels." Most mobile units are as big as moving vans. They're paralyzed in traffic. They can't get down narrow alleys or crooked streets. They bog down on muddy roads and fields.

They require the use of a big trailer generator—or else there's a hunt for power and permission to string cable.

To illustrate, Colledge recalls the time a big airliner coming into Washington's National Airport undershot its approach and wound up in the water. "The big unit we had then," he says, "couldn't squeeze through a narrow place in the road that led to the water's edge. We couldn't drive it off the road because the monster would have bogged down in mud. We had to park, string yards of cable, rig up a temperamental trailer generator, set up our massive 100-pound cameras and then try to shoot over the heads of the crowd as victims were brought ashore. We got some swell shots of Homburg hats and backs of bald heads. With the Cadillac, we could have rolled right up to the edge of the water. The cameraman on the roof turret could have shot right down on the people coming ashore and you'd have been able to see the expressions on their faces."

Colledge can cite dozens of similar frustrating assignments, like the time his crew spent an hour power hunting and cable laying before they could televise the scene of the train that crashed through Union Station in Washington. "In spite of it, we were on the air an hour and seven minutes after it happened," he recalls. "But with the limousine studio, we could have wheeled right up to the station, hooked up the hand camera, and sent a man inside the station with it. We'd have been telecasting ten minutes after the crash."

Well the Kissimmee Mecum is in the books and what a great event it was. Before I give you the final results let me just say there was money in the building, or on the Internet. Sales were really good and believe it or not a person had multiple alternatives in seeking an antique car, as there were several opportunities to purchase one and as the British auctioneers says "well bought".

However to point out one fact, GM and Ford do not have anything on Mopar. Consider an original unrestored 1969 Dodge Charger Daytona Wing car with 6,400 original miles sold for an eye watering \$1,430,000....Now the going price for restored better-then new Plymouth Winged Cars was \$400,000-\$800,000 and other Dodge Daytona Wing cars were selling for \$400,000-600,000. Most of these cars were restored to "Graveyard Cars" (TV Show on Velocity) levels, yet an original low mileage survivor sold for double 100 point fully restored cars. There very few pre-war cars and the high dollar ones that were there did not meet reserve.

Elizabeth Arden's 1935 Fleetwood Town Cabriolet with the original paper work and a compete ownership history from when Ms. Arden's driver took delivery high bid at \$110,000 and was a No Sale. 1958 Eldorado Brougham Body 402, completely restored with working air suspension and a compete set of original vanities, sold for \$159,500.







1941 Cadillac Highlights



Why do people collect the cars they do? Some collect to preserve the past or a memory. Some collect for the thrill, the hunt, the quest. Some simply collect for fun or as a hobby. A quick glance through the CLC directory shows the 1941 Cadillac might be the most popular year for club members. A number of Valley Forge Region members own 1941 Cadillacs of various models; some more then one. The 1941 Cadillac featured several design changes and new features which might explain their appeal. A few notable features of the 1941 Cadillac include:

- A new grille design with a bolder, more massive appearance
- A new "torpedo" style front fenders and redesigned rear fenders that give the car a more streamlined look
- New "flow through" ventiports on the front fenders, which were functional and allowed air to flow through the engine bay into the passenger compartment
- First introduced in 1936, the 346 cubic inch engine received an update for a new and improved V8 engine that produced 150 horsepower
- First time offered for Cadillac was the optional (\$125) Hydra-Matic automatic transmission
- A new column-mounted gearshift lever
- An improved suspension system for a smoother ride
- 27 different body styles were available including a convertible, a coupe, a sedan, and formal cars
- Improved interior with more comfortable seating and more luxurious materials

Overall, the 1941 Cadillac was a stylish, powerful and luxurious car with many advanced features for its time.
