

My 1976 Series 75

Pennsylvania from Tecumseh, Michigan, I began operating the car's accessories and realized I had lot of work to do.

One thing that suppressed my slight buyer's remorse was our daughter's gleeful reaction when she saw it in the driveway. She ran outside, jumped in the back seat and turned on the reading lamp. In the months ahead, the right rear seat would become her reserved spot.





The engine ran reasonably well, but was smoking somewhat on acceleration, the underside was a little rough and virtually all of the accessories needed to be gone through and rebuilt. These issues told me this would be a similar job to my previous project car, only more so. Although minor, perhaps the first item that had to be remedied was the aftermarket chrome grill extension featuring an ultra-tacky hood ornament. The bad taste police placed this in the trash within hours of the car's arrival. Now the real work could begin.

I started the restoration with front hood, fenders, wheel wells and radiator cross member which all came off fairly easily. Except for the hood, these were then sandblasted and repainted (only the inside of the fenders). More importantly, I was able to raise the body from the frame by approximately six inches so that the frame and rockers were exposed. The underside was then sandblasted. You wouldn't believe how blast media can get into everything. Once the underside was down to bare metal, I was pleased to see how well-preserved the sheet metal was. I discovered a small amount of rust behind the evaporator cover and on the bottom of the passenger fender behind the stainless trim. Since the problem areas would not be visible normally, I ground and welded new metal in fairly quickly. After some Eastwood company paint, the body could go back on the mounts.



The interior got the treatment next. The door cards were removed so that the insides could be resealed. Replacing the bronze hinge pin bushings for the doors was a pain, especially when it came to the

heavy rear doors. I am sure the image of me struggling to mount the doors was comical.

New floor insulation was installed so that when the car went to Accurate Auto Upholstery in Edgemont, PA, the new carpet, door piping, etc., could go in. While the car was there, I asked them to address the rust behind the c-pillar. After removing the vinyl roof and inspecting, they reprimed and put a new vinyl pad in place. They also told me they found

no rust under the vinyl anyway. Oh well.



A series 75 has an extensive number of ventilation system components. Much of it is in duplicate as the back seat has its own equipment in the trunk. Everything was taken out of the car and laid in a big pile on



my garage floor. The components – except for the compressor and condenser which could be dealt with locally – were sent to Florida for a total rebuild. When the ventilation system components finally returned, they were reinstalled in the car. The next step was to have everything calibrated and tuned in by Jerry at Keystone Auto Electrical. He was very helpful and capable. Later, he would become instrumental in wiring harness work.

The original radio, while still in the dashboard, had been bypassed by an aftermarket system mounted under the dash. The original antenna had been replaced by an aftermarket unit. Because the car did not have the rear radio control option, I located the components from another series 75 that had been junked in North Carolina. After the radio was rebuilt along with a replacement factory antenna, I had fun changing the dashboard radio stations from the back seat.








The 500 cubic inch engine has been the most challenging part of the project. After removing and rebuilding it several times due to overheating and other problems, the engine seems to have settled down. I'm always looking at the gauges installed under the dash though to make sure everything is running properly. I placate myself by reading comments online from other Cadillac 500 owners. They seem to feel that 210 degrees is normal.

I enjoy reflecting on how far the car has travelled. While the engine stayed mostly local in various machine shops, the front bumper and door handles have been to Houston, the air-conditioning system wintered in Tampa and the dash clock spent time out West, I think. The list goes on. But the best thing about owning the Fleetwood is I have gotten to know a lot of nice people and that's what made it all worthwhile.









Best States For Car Enthusiasts

Delaware is the best state for car enthusiasts, according to a study from <u>Chrysler Capital.</u> **Delaware**, which has a whopping overall Car Enthusiast Score of 99.2/100 based on a cumulative score ranking the state's registered vehicles and the number of car clubs and experience days.

Partly due to the compact size of the state, car enthusiasts can find a car club every 100 square miles, so they won't have to drive far to meet up with like-minded friends. There's also a car event every 311 square miles, a racetrack and racetrack experience every 1,244 square miles, and just 2.4 people for every vehicle in the state.



In second place and not far behind **Delaware** is **Connecticut**, which has a very good Car Enthusiast Score, too, of 96.0/100. **New Jersey** third across the finish line for best states overall. The state claims a lofty Car Enthusiast Score of 93.6/100 and is particularly appealing to the sociable enthusiast. It offers them a car club every 148 square miles and a car event every 165 square miles. , **Ohio** at 88.8, **North Carolina** at 88.4, **Illinois** at 86.8, **Indiana** at 86.4, **Maryland** at 86.4, **Florida** at 84.0 and **Massachusetts** at 82.8.

Car clubs are often formed along the lines of vehicle type, brand or other common interest, they are perhaps the perfect way to celebrate the automobile in all its glory. And it is **Texas**, according to *Chrysler Capitol's* findings, that enjoys this aspect of car culture the most. The Southern state was found to have some 149 clubs devoted to cars. Next on the list, and a little way behind, is **California**, with 112, followed by **North Carolina** and **Washington** state, each with a round 100.

Methodology

Chrysler Capitol gathered data on the number of registered vehicles, car clubs, car events, and driving experience days in each U.S. state. Then they looked at the population and size of each state to calculate the number of people per car and the number of square miles per club, event, and experience day. The states with the lowest number of people per vehicle were ranked highly as this meant there were fewer people sharing vehicles. States with the lowest number of square miles were ranked highly as this revealed the states that have the most activities for car enthusiasts per square mile in their state. All states were ranked out of 20 for each category (registered vehicles, number of clubs, events, racetracks and experience days) and then given an overall score out of 100.

Hubcap Crest Restoration

For 1963 Through Mid 1980s Cadillacs By Robert Schles





Now that spring is upon us I though it might be time to clean up the hupcap crests that have faded over time. I bought the 10 piece Testers paint set which have the five colors used in the Cadillac crest; white, black, blue, red and gold. The paint can be found in any hobby store, home center or online.





The first thing to do is to remove the crest from the back of the wheel cover by releasing the clips holding

the mounting studs. Then thoroughly clean the crest to remove any dirt, grease and road grime. You may want to use a brass brush to remove any loose paint as well. Finish up by cleaning the surface with alcohol or acetone to remove any residue left by the cleaner.

I found using a toothpick as a paint brush was the best way to get into the tight corners in the crest. A different toothpick was used for each color. The picture on the right shows the black paint being applied with the toothpick.





One by one I applied the five colors to the crest letting each color dry before applying the next color. Don't worry if you don't have a steady hand and go outside the areas as I did. The paint can be cleaned up very easily afterwards with an Xatco knife.





If you find any areas that need a second coat of paint, now is a good time to apply it. Once you are satisfied with the freshly painted crest, spray one or two coats of clear coat to seal and protect the restored crest.

Before reattaching the crest, now is the time to thoroughly clean and polish the wheel cover. Reattach the crest to the wheel cover with the clips to the mounting studs. Make sure the crest is on tight so it doesn't rattle or comes lose while driving.





Now just three more wheels to do and I'll be ready for the next car show. Incidentally, this technique can also be used on the trunk crest to restore that as well.

Selling Cadillacs During the Age of Eisenhower, Part One – The Buyers

If you want to study American culture during the 1950s, look at Cadillac advertising.

Consider the ad shown to the right. The message is that buying a Cadillac is a way to preserve your perfect family. The youthful but serious wife is clad in Christian Dior's "New Look." Her well-cared-for baby is on her lap. The daughter is her mother's understudy. The boys in their suits with short pants look toward their mother, waiting for permission to change into their play clothes and climb trees. The home is nicely, but conservatively decorated.


This was just part of Cadillac's world, crafted by a master ad-man,

James Adams. For almost twenty



years until his death in 1956, Adams personally chose the pictures and wrote every word of Cadillac's national advertising.





Adams great gift was that he understood these America's upper-middle-class consumers and helped them see 4,500 pounds of steel, rubber, glass, and cloth as a sign of hard-won prosperity. Adams communicated the image of Cadillac; in the process describing what it meant to be successful during the decade following World War II.

Not all of Adams's scenes were domestic. Other ads would feature evenings at the theatre, parties around the pool, high-powered board meetings, and diplomatic fetes. Any aspect of the successful life of the mid-20th century was fodder for Adams's goal – to make Cadillac the one irreplaceable symbol of 1950s success.





- Food and Drink: A food vendor will be on-site. All participants and guests are responsible for their own food and beverages.
- Chairs: All participants and guests are responsible for bringing their own chairs.
