

The Birth of a Region



In 1975 back when men were wearing polyester leisure suits, women wore wrap dresses and Disco was all the rage, the Valley Forge Region was formed. With the region celebrating it's 50th anniversary in 2025, over the

next several issues of *The Goddess* we will be taking a look back at the region. In this issue we see how and why the region came to be.

In early January of 1975 Lewis A. Howells sent a letter to all members of the Cadillac & LaSalle Club in the Delaware Valley area.

Here is an excerpt of that letter:

"Where have you been hiding these many years, why should the West Coast have all glory and prestige in showing their Cadillacs and LaSalles. It is now time the East Coast became known and to out do the West. As "Horace Greeley" once said; "Go West Young Man", he didn't mean that they were taking all the Cadillacs and LaSalles with them when they went."

"It is time to rejuvenate the East Coast; especially Pennsylvania. There are eighty eight members registered with the National Office of the Cadillac LaSalle Club from Pennsylvania and Delaware, eighty three from Pennsylvania in which more than half live within fifty miles of Philadelphia and five members who live in Delaware.

"I am asking for the support of all Pennsylvanian's and Delawarean's in forming this region. The region will be called the "VALLEY FORGE REGION" in memory of our country's founding father George Washington, and where he encamped his army in the winter of 1777-78 and fought for what he believed in. "

"I would like to hear from all members with ideas and suggestions as soon as possible so that an organizational meeting can be set up to lay the foundation of our region; also arrange meets, social events, etc. for the enjoyment of all every one show that they are interested in a local region by submitting a check for \$2.00 to cover postage and printing materials"

50 years later the principles of VFR Region are still the same. Our activities include a monthly meeting for dinner. During the get-together we conduct club business and socialize while discussing up coming car shows, local tours to various automotive and non-automotive destinations and have lots of FUN!

A Tale of Restoration and Devotion:

The Journey with My 1957 Cadillac Biarritz By Aaron Driben



My affinity for Cadillacs runs deep, rooted in childhood memories of my grandfather's 1959 Sedan

DeVille, a symbol of his love for luxury and style, traits I now proudly continue. In 2002, my fascination with classic Cadillacs led me on a quest for the perfect symbol of automotive elegance and history: a blue 1957 Cadillac Biarritz convertible. Revered for its extravagant styling, luxurious comfort, and powerful performance, this masterpiece of



mid-20th-century American automotive engineering continues to captivate enthusiasts and collectors alike. The allure of its rarity, coupled with the last-year single headlights and extensive options, sealed my decision.

After an exhaustive search, I discovered my dream car—a basket case languishing in Baltimore, awaiting restoration. In the annals of automotive history, few cars have achieved the iconic status of the 1957 Cadillac Biarritz. For me, the Cadillac Biarritz of 1957 epitomizes the pinnacle of the "jet age" design philosophy that dominated the automotive industry in the late 1950s. With its flamboyant tailfins, abundant chrome trim, and imposing presence, the Biarritz exuded an unparalleled sense of opulence and sophistication. This convertible mode, part of the Eldorado series, featured a distinctive rear-end design that showcased Cadillac's commitment to pushing the boundaries of automotive styling.



The seller, a Cadillac aficionado, recommended Jenkins Interiors in NC for the restoration—a meticulous process that spanned nearly three years. Entrusting my cherished find to Jenkins Interiors was a leap of faith, but one that ultimately paid off in spades. (See the July 2024 issue of the Goddess for the story on Jenkins Interiors) Halfway through the full restoration, I decided to surprise my family with a visit to see the car for the first time. It had been a well-kept secret, until my son inadvertently spilled the beans to my wife over the phone. Her reaction, while not surprised, cost me a nice piece of jewelry—a small price to pay for the joy that awaited.



What sets my Biarritz apart is its uniqueness. Among the features is its factory air conditioning—a rarity for its time. The stunning two-toned blue and white interior complements its spectacular exterior color, making it a standout even among its Cadillac brethren. The sheer amount of chrome, painstakingly restored at great expense, highlights its undeniable allure. Step inside the Biarritz, and you were greeted with a sumptuous interior tailored for comfort and extravagance. Plush leather seating, complemented by intricate chrome



accents created an ambiance of unparalleled luxury. The dashboard featured a dazzling array of gauges and controls, emphasizing Cadillac's commitment to both style and functionality. Powered by a 365 cubicinch V8 engine, the Biarritz delivered formidable performance, ensuring a smooth and effortless driving experience. The engine was paired with Cadillac's innovative Hydra-Matic automatic transmission, setting a benchmark for luxury and refinement in the automotive industry.

Since 2003, the Biarritz has been a cherished member of our family. The car was initially restored by Jenkins, it underwent a meticulous refresh at Harbor Auto Restorations to maintain its pristine condition—a testament to our commitment to preserving its legacy. The Biarritz made its debut at the prestigious 2006 AACA Hershey Fall meet, a milestone event for my family. It was the first time we beheld the Cadillac in its fully restored glory—a culmination of years of anticipation and dedication. Under the guidance of Lewis Jenkins, I learned the intricacies of showcasing a classic car with finesse. His advice, like not lowering the convertible top to avoid long-term wrinkles, remains a guiding principle.























Attending The 2024 Cadillac & LaSalle Club Grand National with a 1931 355 Convertible Coupe

The Cadillac & LaSalle Club 2024 Grand National Car Show was recently held in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania in the beginning of June 2024. The Wyndham complex of two hotels is a nice car show destination. It can easily handle a large show, but has limited shade, and almost no food options on site.

Within the car show itself, the display of cars seems to be noticeably be changing from



is the club membership. The cars on display are getting newer in age as the owners demographics are changing. Members are moving toward cars that offer air conditioning, and other comforts. I sure do understand that movement. The older classic cars on display were noticeably fewer, which was a sad sight for me personally.



I feel the highlight of the show are the classic cars. The best of show, deservedly, was a 1934 V16 Individual Custom Coupe, in a tan/gray color. It was simply gorgeous. There were many outstanding examples through the years. The attendance of cars overall was pretty good, and enough to satisfy any vintage Cadillac lover. The number of people attending (*over 800*) was a sizable number and I think the hopes of the clubs who

arranged this event were met, as a great success.

We brought a 1931 Cadillac series 355 convertible coupe. This car has a rich history where it had been an outstanding original car for completeness and correctness. The former owner was a well known collector from the Baltimore area. Mr. Charles Gillette, a multi-make automobile dealer, among other things. When he passed away in his 90's, he was the last and longest living of all the WW2 Frogmen. He left the service to be involved with automotive magazines similar to Motor Trend, as an article writer, critic and contributor. He went on to have a very successful VW dealership along with some other makes. He, as a car collector, ending with a sizable collection, started gathering the cars he loved and having them restored to the highest level.

The 1931 Cadillac we purchased from his estate, was one of his earliest and favorite cars. We

believe it was twice restored where in the early 2000 years it was campaigned to all the major club shows and concours events.

It has won just about every prestigious award to the highest levels. The thought to bring the car back to a Cadillac & LaSalle Club Grand National for judging 20 years later was my hope, and to again win the Senior award. And, Yes, it did.



Cadillac: 120 Years of Design and Engineering **Innovation**

On August 2022 Cadillac celebrated it's 120th anniversary. Twelve decades of industry leadership in engineering, design and innovation that have set the standard for luxury motoring since 1902 and turned the brand name into a shorthand for excellence. Many of the technologies and features drivers now take for granted had their inception at Cadillac. To help spread the word on Cadillac's history of innovations and achievements, Cadillac created a fact sheet. On the next few pages is the timeline fact sheet highlighting the accomplishments over the past 120 years.

1908 Cadillac earns its "Standard of the World" moniker after winning the Dewar Trophy for demonstrating the full interchangeability of three different cars' 721 standardized component parts

1909 General Motors Inc. acquires Cadillac

1910 Cadillac introduces closed-body design ("limousine") as standard catalog offering Delco coil and breaker-point ignition offered as an improvement over magneto ignition

1912 Cadillac introduces new Charles Kettering-designed Delco electrical system Electric self-starting made possible and makes automobile operation more accessible to women and eliminates crank starter

Cadillac wins second Dewar Trophy for electric self-starting innovation and first automaker to receive this accolade twice

1915 Cadillac introduces the first mass-produced V8 engine U.S. War Department purchases more than 2,000 Cadillac V8 models for use in Europe during WWI


